EXTRAJUDICIAL MEASURES PROGRAM

- The Extrajudicial Measures Diversion is an innovative police and community partnership designed to:
 - Hold young people accountable
 - Increase the victims and communities' involvement in this Diversion process
 - Reduce youth crime through activities that influence attitudes and behaviours.

Youth Diversion

- You have been involved in an offence that has resulted in a police officer being called to investigate. The police officer, following investigation of the incident, has decided to refer you to Community Options for Justice (Oxford).

What is the Extrajudicial Measures Program (EJM)?

- Extrajudicial Measures is a pre-charge intervention.
- It is a diversion process whereby a police officer investigates an offence(s) but does not initiate legal proceedings at that point.
- EJM is a six-month program that affords you the opportunity to be accountable for your behaviour and participate in a process to make amends instead of continuing with legal proceedings at this time.

What is the Next Step?

- You are expected to connect with Community Options for Justice (Oxford) and you will be required to make an appointment for an initial meeting where an agreement will be made.

What will happen if I do not successfully complete all expectations of the program?

If you do not follow through with the agreement made with Community Options for Justice, the Police Service and Arresting Officer will be notified and they will determine the appropriate next steps.
